



## OVERALL RANKING : EGYPT COMFORTABLY TOPPING

Egypt is getting a head start in the overall ranking of the 12th edition of the All-Africa Games. At the end of the second day of competitions, Egyptian Pharaohs won 30 medals, including 8 gold, 12 silver and 10 bronze. They are followed by Algeria with 21 medals (7 gold, 6 silver, 8 bronze). South Africa, stands in the third place with 14 medals, including seven gold medals. The host country, Morocco, is fourth with 21 medals including 5 gold, 9 silver and 7 bronze.

## BOXING : THE RAG BREAKS A NEW RECORD !

Record for the 12th edition of the All Africa Games! With 153 men boxers and 50 women boxers representing 34 countries, the continental competition will have the largest number of participation of all the African Games and the African Championships editions ever. The official random draw took place Tuesday night at the Moulay Rachid National Sports Centre in Salé, under the supervision of the competition's technical director, the Austrian Waldemar Minsel. The playoffs have already started yesterday, Wednesday. The semi-finals and the final will take place on August 28th and 29th in two sessions.





## FOOTBALL U20 : SENEGAL AND MALI LEADERS OF THEIR GROUP !

After that their match against Senegal ended up with a draw, on the first day of the Group B competition, Mali dominated Burundi with 3 goals to 0. With a total of 4 points in two matches, the Malian Eaglets and the Teranga Lion Cubs share altogether the head of the group B, while Burundi is definitively eliminated with a draw. All will be fixed on for Mali during their last match against Ghana, in the second place with 3 points. The situation is, more or less, similar in Group A. After winning South Africa in the first match by forfeit, the Atlas Lion Cubs (men) lost their second match against Burkina Faso on a 2-0. As a result, Nigeria and Burkina Faso are both topping the group A with 4 points each. Morocco follows with 3 points and will need to recover in the last match against Nigeria to secure a place in the semi-finals.
