OVERALL RANKING NIGERIA TAKES UP THE SECOND PLACE

A dazzling rise for Nigeria in the overall ranking of the All Africa Games 12th edition. After having overtaken Algeria then Morocco, Nigeria finished the day of Thursday in the second place. Nigeria holds 103 medals so far, including 40 gold, 28 silver and 35 bronze. South Africa is thus in third place with 77 medals (32 gold, 24 silver, 21 bronze). Egypt maintains its position of imperturbable

leader and seems out of reach once and for all from the new challenger which has just overtaken 3 countries in 4 days. Actually, Egypt holds more than twice the Nigerian score with 229 medals. The biggest loser in the ranking is Morocco, which lost two places in two days. On Thursday, it finished in fifth position with 93 medals.

MOROCCO LEADER OF THE SCORE !

With 4 gold, 2 silver and one bronze medals, Morocco dominated the boxing events that ended Thursday. Moroccans Mohamed Hamout, Tarik Allali and Abdelhaq Nadir all won gold in the "featherweight", "middleweight" (75kg)

and "lightweight" (63kg) categories. The host country is followed by Botswana, in second place with 4 medals (2 gold, 1 silver and 1 bronze). In third place, Algeria, won for its part 4 medals (1 gold, 3 bronze).

DOUBLE CONSECRATION FOR ANGOLA

Angola won both men's and women's handball tournaments of 12th All Africa Games. Opposed in men's final to the Egyptians yesterday Thursday at the Mohammed V Sports Complex Sports Hall in Casablanca, the Angolan finished victorious with a score of (31-25). Earlier in the day, the Moroccan men's handball team defeated their Algerian opponents

with a score of 25-22 in the bronze medal match.

In women's final, Cameroon lost against Angola with a score of 25-28, winning thereby, the silver medal. The ranking match ended with the D.R. Congo's tight victory over Guinea with 32-22.
